## Ordinance No 94

Be it ordained by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Englewood that it shall be a misdemeanor for any owner or driver of any automobile car or truck or motorcycle to run the same with open cut-out within the corporate limits of the Town of Englewood.

"This contract made and entered into on this 24th day of May 1929, by and between the town of Englewood, a municipal Corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Tennessee,

Party of the first part, and Asphalt Distributing Company a Corporation of St. Louis Missouri

Witnesseth, that for the consideration hereinafter set forth first party hereby contracts with second party to give to the streets and roads in the town of Englewood certain treatment of rock and asphalt as follows

The surface of the road to be treated shall be cleaned of all loose and foreign material, dirt and dust by sweeping with a rotary sweeper and hand brooms, Cakes of clay, dust or other material, which do not constitute an integral part of the road surface to be treated, shall be removed. If necessary a blade grader shall be used to remove clay or dust which is tightly packed under the edges. Bituminous material shall not be applied to a road surface until the surface has been thoroughly cleaned.

To clean, dry road surface the bituminous material conforming to the specifications for bituminous Oil Number 2, for cold applications or Coal tar material Number 2 for surfacing treatment, shall be applied at a uniform

rate of from three-tenths (0.3) to four tenths (0.4) gallon per square yard. The application shall be made by means of some approved type of self-propelled pressure distributor. Dry Crushed Stone as described in state specifications shall then be applied over the surface at the rate of twenty (20) to forty (40) pounds per square yard. This stone shall be spread with a self-propelled one man grader, so that all depressions shall be filled with crushed stone. Care shall be taken to avoid scraping of the road so as to remove the bituminous material. This application of bituminous material shall be permitted to soak into the surface of the road for at least six (6) hours before making the second application of stone or bituminous material. Dry Crushed Stone conforming to state specifications, shall be distributed uniformly over the surface at the rate of thirty (30) to fifty (50) pounds per square yard. A bituminous material conforming to specifications for bituminous oil number 2 for cold application or coal tar material number 2 for surfacing treatment, shall be applied at a uniform rate of from three-tenths (0.3) to four-tenths (0.4) gallons per square yard. This <sup>second</sup> application of bituminous material shall be made within five days after the first application unless this is prevented by the weather; in which case the second application shall be made as soon afterwards as the weather will permit. Immediately after the second application of bituminous material, the stone shall be leveled with self-propelled one man grader, and shall be kept in smooth conditions by means of such a grader until the bituminous material begins to harden, at which time the surface shall be rolled with a power roller. Weighing not less than three tons, until the entire surface is thoroughly compacted. If the bituminous material should break or be removed from any part of the surface before the second application such places shall be thoroughly cleaned and retreated with bituminous material before placing the stone for the second application. If at any time, after the application of bituminous material and before the completion of the contract, the surface should become sticky and adhere to the wheels of vehicles, the contractor, shall apply additional crushed

Done in such amounts as may be necessary to remedy this condition. The Contractor shall repair any breaks which may occur in the finished surface before completion of the contract.

The bituminous material shall be applied under the weather limitations as set out in State requirements for work to be done for it.

First party agrees to pay the price of \$1.00 per ton and the freight for the rock used in this work, and agrees to pay ten and three-fourths (10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) cents per gallon and the freight for the asphalt liquid used in this work, and also demurrage if any. On both rock and liquid, it further agrees to pay two (20) cents per gallon for the application of the liquid and to pay for all labor used by Second party according to the pay roll sheet therefor, which shall be kept in duplicate and a copy thereof furnished to first party. It further agrees to pay for the machinery to be used by second party as follows:

For Jordan roller, \$3.00 per hour  
 For Kelly roller, \$3.50 per hour  
 For No 1 Grader, \$2.75 per hour

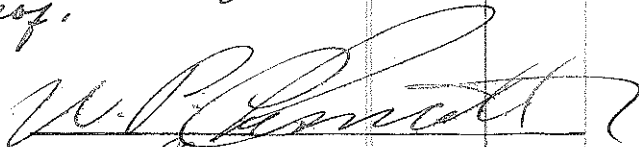

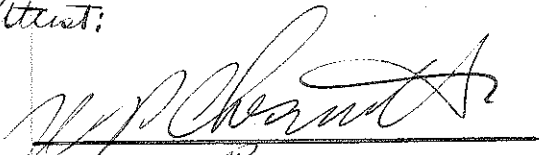

Whereas, the Town of Englewood, in Mc. Minn County, Tennessee contemplates the construction of a municipal waterworks system with funds provided by a loan and grant from the United States of America, and,

Whereas, it is necessary that rates and charges for water furnished by said contemplated waterworks system of the Town to its patrons be established.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Englewood, as follows:

Section 1. That the following rates and charges for services contemplated to be rendered by said waterworks system of the Town of Englewood be and the same are hereby established as follows:

Each consumer shall pay a minimum charge of \$1.50 per month with an allowance of 3,000 gallons of water, and all water consumed in addition thereto shall be charged for at the rate of 25¢ per 1,000 gallons of water.

Section 2. Beginning at the time fire hydrants service is first rendered to the Town for general municipal purposes by said waterworks system, said Town shall pay into the Waterworks fund, from current funds or from the proceeds of Taxes of said Town, a sum at the rate of \$15.00 per year per hydrant as said service accrues.

Section 3. The Town reserves the right to enter into contracts with large users of water by ordinances covering such contracts. The Town shall not, however, render any free service or allow any preferential rates to be established for the users of water of the same class.

Section 4. The service line is to be installed to the property line of the user by the Town and the user is to provide for installing his own pipes and fixtures from the property line. The Town will furnish the meter and meter box. All consumers connecting with the system while it is being installed or before the water mains are covered will be furnished a meter and meter box and connected into the main line without tapping charges. All consumers connecting into the system after it is installed and the lines

Feb. 12 are covered will be charged the sum of \$5.00 to cover tapping charges. If, for any reason, the service rendered to a consumer is discontinued, he shall be charged a sum of \$1.00 for the reestablishment of such service, and before such service shall be reestablished, the consumer shall pay in advance said sum of \$1.00 for reestablishment, together with any unpaid bill or bills which he may owe for services rendered prior to such discontinuance.

Section 5. All bills for water shall be paid by the 10th of the month following that in which the service is furnished, and if not paid by that time, a 10% penalty shall be charged for non-payment. In the event said bills are not paid on the first day of the third month following that in which the service was rendered, said service shall be discontinued.

## Public Health.

- Sec 1 To knowingly sell any kind of diseased, or corrupted or unwholesome provisions, whether for meat or drink, without making the fact known to the buyer.
- Sec 2 To Adulterate for the purpose of sell any substance intended for food, Medicines or drink.
- Sec 3 To Adulterate for the purpose of sell any drug or Medicines in such a manner as to lessen the efficacy or change the operation of such drug or Medicines, or make them injurious to the health, or sell them, knowingly that they are thus Adulterated, and such Adulterated drugs and Medicines shall be forfeited and destroyed.
- Sec 4 To Erect, Conduct or Carry on any Slaughter house within the Corporate limits of the Town of Englewood.
- Sec 5 To deposit any injurious, Matter, Thing or Substance or to do any other act or thing in such a manner or such a place as to injure or pollute the water of any running stream within the Town, or any stream which is made the boundary lines of the Corporate limits, or any other part thereof.
- Sec 6 To permit the side walks in front of ones place of business or premises to remain obstructed or in a filthy state or fail to clean the same after three hours from the Marshall, Policeman or other proper officer of the Town or permit Coal or wood to be place on any side walk or street or to cause or to permit the street in front of ones place of business house or premises to become filthy by the cleaning of dirt spilt or lost Vegetables, fruits or other articles of a perishable nature from the store or other place longer than 3 hours after notice by the Marshall.
- Sec 7 For any person being the owner thereof to fail or refuse to remove dead animals out of the Town within 3 hours after notice from the Marshall, or any other Town officer to so remove the same.



- Sec 8 To allow any stagnant water to accumulate or stand on any lot or tract of land owned or controlled by any person within the Town.
- Sec 9 To refuse or fail to comply with any notice order or requirement of the Board of Health.
- Sec 10 For any butcher or other person to haul <sup>butchered</sup> fresh meat on any street or alley in the Town unless the same be securely covered.
- Public Safety.
- Sec 11 To ride or drive any beast of burden upon any highway, thoroughfare or other public place, more rapidly than at a moderate gait, unless in case of urgent necessity; or to turn any animal loose, or to ride, or drive, or lead or lead any animal on a side walk or street crossing within the Town.
- Sec 12 To become intoxicated or go to sleep while in charge of any vehicle as driver, or otherwise, on the streets or public places of the Town, or to drive through the streets so carelessly as to endanger any vehicle property or person.
- Sec 13 To leave standing any wall, building chimney or other structure, owned by any person, which shall be dangerous to passers-by, after twelve (12) hours notice by the Town Marshall or other lawful authority to remove same.
- Sec 14 To knowingly allow any horse mule or ass over the age of six months or any other dangerous, vicious animal to run at large within the Town, being the owner or keeper thereof.
- Sec 15 To place or continue any wood, lumber, rubbish, manure or any other obstructions on any street, or alley, lane or side walk longer than 24 hours, except for building purposes and under regulations made and permission granted by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners, or the Mayor.
- Sec 16 To leave open any cellar or vault door gratings, on any side walk, or cause or permit any side walk in front of any ~~house~~ in front of his, hers, or their place of business place or premises to become or continue so broken as to endanger life or limb or permit any wall or cistern or other excavation to remain open or unenclosed to the danger of other persons or property or to carelessly leave open any gate across <sup>or over</sup> any side walk street or alley in the Town.
- Sec 17 To catch onto, or get onto, or get off of any moving train, engine, or car, not being an employe of the Railroad Company within the corporate limits of the Town for the purposes of stealing a ride or riding merely for recreation.
- Sec 18 To throw any stones, or flint stones or other hard substances with slippers, slings or other contrivances any where upon the streets alleys or vacant lots in the Town of Englewood.
- Sec 19 To congregate or assemble at the public well for a longer time than is absolutely necessary to get water.

- Sec 20 To Congregate or assemble and remain on any sidewalks in the Town so as to obstruct Travel on the same.
- Sec 21 To obstruct any public highway, street or alley public grounds or commons in any way by hurrying persons animals or animals houses within the town limits; or to hit or throw or strike upon or drive a wagon, buggy, Automobile, Truck or other Vehicle, or ride any Bicycle upon any side walk in the Town, and it shall also be a Violation of this Ordinance for any person to ride a bicycle at a reckless rate of speed in any part of the Town.
- Sec 22 For any Rail Road Company to Allow its Employees to stop any Engine Car or Train on any public Road or Street Crossing within the Corporate limits of the Town of Englewood for a longer period of time than Minutes.
- Public Morals.
- Sec 23 To keep a house of ill-fame for the purpose of Prostitution and Licentiousness, a Gambling house - a house drunkness quarreling fighting or other breaches of the Peace are carried on, or committed, to the disturbance of others either by <sup>the</sup> owner or other persons allowed to frequent the same
- Sec 24 To be an inmate of or board at or to take meals at any house of ill-fame, or to knowingly visit or frequent a house of ill-fame for the purpose of lewdness.
- Sec 25 To commit the offense of lewdness, or to make any indecent exposure of the person, or publicly do any act of lewd looks, pictures or other things or perform any lewd or immoral play or other representation.
- Sec 26 For any lewd woman or common prostitute to walk the streets of the town of Englewood after the hour of Nine O'clock P.M. or to solicitate any person at any time, day or night on any street, alley or public place in the Town to accompany her or them to any place for the purpose of Prostitution.
- Sec 27 For any Male person knowingly to walk or ride or be in company of or with any lewd woman or prostitute upon the streets of the Town either by day or by night.
- Sec 28 To wilfully disquiet or disturb any assemblage of persons met for religious worship or for Educational, or literary purposes or as a lodge of, or for the purpose of engaging in or performing any act promoting the cause of Charity or temperance by noisy profane discourse, rant or indecent behavior or any other act - at or near any such place of Meeting.
- Sec 29 To have about the town having in their possession any gambling table or any device for the entertainment of any <sup>whenever to</sup> <sup>play or</sup> <sup>gambling</sup>.
- Sec 30 To play at any game of hazard or address for money or other valuable thing, or to make a bet or wager for money or other valuable thing; or encourage, promote, aid or assist the playing at any game, or the making of wagers for money or other valuable thing

- Sec 31. To play at any game of billiards, Ten Pins, Croquet or other games, in any licensed house on Sunday.
- Enforcement of Laws.
- Sec 32. To knowingly and wilfully oppose or resist any officer of the Town, County, or State, or other authorized persons, in serving or attempting to serve any legal writ, summons, or process.
- Sec 33. To rescue or attempt to rescue, by force or violence, or by other unlawful means, any one who is in custody after lawful arrest, before or after conviction, knowing or being informed that the offender is under lawful arrest.
- Sec 34. To wilfully fail or refuse to attend as a witness in a trial before the Recorder or other Town Courts when legally summoned by any competent officer of the Town or County under process issued by a proper officer.
- Sec 35. To intentionally create any disturbance during a trial before the Recorder or other Courts of the Town or Meeting of the Board of Mayor and Commissioners, or any committee or assemblage of officers or agents of the Town.
- Sec 36. Upon failure of any person to pay or secure any fine and costs adjudged against him or her in the Town Courts such person shall be committed to the Town Prison or work house until the same be paid, secured, or worked out as required by law and Ordinance.
- Sec 37. To fail, neglect or refuse to make such report or reports as required by Ordinance of any Officer, Agent or Servant of the Town.
- Sec 38. Any Officer, Agent or Servant of the Town who shall fail or refuse to perform any of the duties imposed upon him or required of him by the laws of the State or Ordinances of the Town shall upon conviction, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and subject to a fine of not less than Twenty five nor more than Fifty dollars; and shall forfeit his right to said office and shall be immediately relieved from the duties of the same by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners.
- Sec 39. Any Officer, Agent or Servant of the Town becoming intoxicated, or publicly drunk shall upon conviction be expelled from his <sup>said</sup> office by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners.
- Miscellaneous Ordinances.
- Sec 40. To wilfully disturb or disquiet any Cemetery in the Town by noise profane discourse made or indecent behavior or any other act within one hundred yards of any Cemetery in the Town.
- Sec 41. To wilfully destroy, mutilate or deface or injure or remove any tombstone or monument or grave stone or other articles placed in any Cemetery in the Town, or to wilfully injure any fence tree flower or shrub in any Cemetery in the Town.

- Sec 42 To wilfully disturb the peace of others by violence or offensive language. Conduct or carriage by land or unusual noises by discharging any gun pistol or fire works fire crackers by obscene or profane language or language calculated to cause a breach of the peace by assaulting, striking or fighting by committing any act upon his or her property to disturb those in the vicinity.
- Sec 43. To create or maintain a nuisance upon ones own or others property either as owner agent or tenant,
- Sec 44. To carry on any business in the town without first obtaining a license as required by ordinance.
- Sec 45 To play here Ball or racket ball or any similar game

## WATER SYSTEM COST \$100,000

Sevierville Will Celebrate Opening of New Plant. Bailey & Co., Sevierville, Tennessee

SEVIERVILLE, May 25—A formal opening is planned soon in celebration of Sevierville's new municipal water and sewer system, costing close to \$100,000 and constructed without a dollar's outlay in bonds.

The system went into use this week, and connections are rapidly being made by residents.

It was installed with the aid of a PWA grant of \$22,000 and a loan of \$74,000, with only the system itself as security. The plan calls for amortization of the loan portion in 20 years through payments on water bills.

The work was started August 14, 1934. The contract for the water system was let to W. L. Bailey & Co., Nashville, and the sewerage system was constructed by G. M. Ferris, Athens.

Wells were dug by the Morris Drilling Co., Knoxville. There are two wells which on tests pumped more than 250 gallons a minute. They are more than 300 feet deep.

The supply tank is of 150,000 gallons capacity. Tanks are located on Chandler hill, north of Sevierville.

At the official opening date, which is yet to be set, it is planned to have Kenneth Markwell, state PWA engineer, and others, present.

The streets of Sevierville, torn up during the laying of water and sewer pipes, will be resurfaced in the next three weeks. It is hoped to have this work done also without a bond issue.
