To the Mayor and commissioners of the town of Englewood I
make the following ~~recommendation~~ submit the following as a budget for the
tax levy for the year 1920, and base it on a supposed valuation of 400000.00

~~For schools,~~
For schools and with 20¢
This should bring in around \$800.00 to which the amount collected
for polls added should make upward of \$1000.00 for school purposes

For Street or road improvement 10¢
This should bring in around \$400.00 which I believe should be expended
in the purchase of about 900 feet suitable tiling to be used where cross
streets or roads leave the main roads. I have made a survey of the town
and find that 900 feet is badly needed.

The time worked by the regular hands, or the funds brought
in in place of work should lay the tiling, grade the streets, and like-
ly superintend this work. Should we succeed in getting this tiling in
this year we will have something permanent done and can build other
improvements onto this in future years.

For a calaboose or town hall 5¢
This should give us about \$200.00 which if not enough to pay for
suitable location and building, it might be enough to make a pay-
ment on same, and the balance can be taken care of by future levies.

For general purposes, which can be used for police 5¢
or other purposes at the will of the commissioners
To this will be added the privileges, and fines which will bring in
around 300 00

I recommend that merchants privileges be changed to
35¢ advalorem when stocks are over 800 00 or over and a minimum of
\$7.50 when less than \$800 00.

I also recommend that polls be \$1.00
